The 2022 Alameda Active Transportation Plan includes priority ("near term") programs (see Table 9) and a "2030 Infrastructure Plan" (see Table 10). All of the projects and programs that were being developed and/or implemented in FY 23/24 are included in one of these tables. CAPITAL PROJECTS (#'s are from Table 10, ATP):

- (#1) Central Ave Safety Project -- Project creates all ages & abilities facility by adding separated bike lanes to Central Ave, and bike lanes in other sections, per the City's draft ATP. It also makes safety improvements by implementing a road diet and adding three roundabouts, and other pedestrian crossing improvements. Completed 100% PSE.
- (#2) Grand Street from Shoreline to Encinal -- Project will add separated two-way bike lanes plus pedestrian crossing improvements to improve safety along this corridor. Finalized designs for segment next to Wood middle school (Shoreline to Otis), and began developing designs for Otis to Encinal segment.
- (#3) Clement Ave Cross Alameda Trail (CAT) from Grand to Broadway -- Project creates all ages & abilities facility by adding two-way separated bike lanes to Clement Ave, widening sub-standard sidewalks and adding crossing improvements. Bid project and prepared to begin construction.
- (#3) Clement/Tilden Project -- Project will add a roundabout, multi-use paths and separated bike lanes, to connect the Cross Alameda Trail project to the Miller-Sweeney Bridge, along Clement and Tilden Way. Completed 95% PS&E.
- (#4 and 5) -- Park St and Webster St were restriped to add bike lanes, which is the initial phase of improvements to these streets, and ped crossing enhancements were included.
- (#8) Oakland-Alameda Estuary Crossing -- PID was completed for this new bicycle/pedestrian connection between Oakland and Alameda, to create a safe and comfortable crossing between the west end of Alameda and Oakland, where none exists. Additional outeach was completed, and City applied for a Waterway Study grant.
- (#9) Estuary Water Shuttle -- Project is a new water shuttle between the west end of Alameda and the Jack London Square area in Oakland, which will create a safe and comfortable near term walking/biking connection, where none exists. All planning and capital activies were completed, to prepare to launch service in July 2024.
- (#11-19) Neighborhood Greenways -- Nine streets will be converted to Neighborhood Greenways (like bike boulevards) by 2030. Began developing implementation approach and hired consultant to support development.
- (#22) Lincoln/Marshall/Pacific Corridor Improvements -- Project will reduce 4-lane high injury corridor to 3 lanes, add bike lanes and one roundabout, and make pedestrian crossing improvements along the 3 miles corridor. Developed 35% PS&E and applied for Safe Streets for All grant. (#30) Broadway/Otis Drive/Doolittle Drive Resurfacing and Improvements -- Coordinated with Caltrans to ensure SHOPP project includes complete street elements.

- (P.25) Safe Routes to Schools -- Supported SR2S efforts
- (P.26) Bike Festival -- Supported this annual one day educational and fun event, geared towards all ages.
- (P.27) Bike Safety Education -- Supported bicycle safety classes for all ages.

Vision Zero Action Plan implementation, which includes implementing the City's rapid response to severe/fatal collisions program and communicating safety messaging to the commuity, is focussed specially on improving safety for vulnerable users.
