Weekend Closure of Gilman Street Between Second Street and Fourth Street for Curb and Gutter Work

Starting Friday, March 7 at 9:00 PM to Sunday, March 9 at 11:30 AM

BERKELEY — Caltrans will temporarily close Gilman Street between Second Street and Fourth Street from Friday, March 7, 2025, at 7:00 PM to Sunday, March 9, 2025, at 11:30 AM to perform curb and gutter work between Second Street and Fourth Street on Gilman Street as part of ongoing roadway improvements.

Closure Details

Start: Friday, March 7, 2025, at 9:00 PM

End: Sunday, March 9, 2025, at 11:30 AM

Location: Gilman Street between Second Street and Fourth Street

During the closure, motorists must use the designated detour routes. Contractor's flaggers will be stationed at the intersections of Gilman and Second St and Gilman and Fourth St to ensure access to residents and business owners within the closure area. Detour signs will be in place to direct traffic along the planned detour path.

The work will involve concrete improvements along Gilman Street between Second Street and Fourth Street, including new curb and gutter installation near the Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) tracks, removal, and replacement of existing concrete curb along Gilman, and other necessary concrete upgrades. The schedule is as follows:

Friday Night: Crews will cut and remove sections of concrete.

Saturday Day: New curbs will be formed and poured.

Saturday Night into Sunday: The roadway will be repaved where the work took place.

Detours:



Motorist traveling Eastbound (towards San Pablo Ave)

- Right turn on Second Street
- Left turn on Cedar St
- Left Turn on Fourth St
- 4. Right on Gilman Street

Motorist traveling Westbound (towards I-580)

- 1. Left Turn on Fourth St
- 2. Right turn on Cedar St
- 3. Right turn on Eastshore Hwy
- 4. Left turn on Gilman Street



Be Work Zone Alert and expect travel delays.
